

## **Thoughts on Today's Verse(s):**

Doesn't it seem kinda strange that Jesus had to actually *command* His disciples to love one another? Not really. If we truly think about it, we find that even with the ones in this world whom we truly love and care about, we often have to *work* at loving them. That's because sometimes every one of us is at least a little, or a lot, unlovable.

I wonder if the other ten found it hard to love Thomas when he refused to believe that they had seen The Lord after His resurrection. And let's face it, the rest of the gang was not happy with James and John when they asked to have a seat of honor in Christ's kingdom. Jesus knew that there would be times when His beloved friends would not agree on what should be done or how to do it thus He *ordered/commanded* them to love one another.

Hmm, sound familiar? Isn't that the way we in the church still operate to this day? Do we not encounter many situations and decisions in which we don't agree? Yep. And it's unavoidable. Due to our fallen human nature, there are many times when we attempt to exert our own will on the affairs of the group, giving little consideration to how that might affect the purposes of the church. We just want what *we* want, giving little or no attention to what God wants. In those moments every one of us can be difficult to love thus requiring a concerted effort on the part of the church to love us.

That's why Jesus *commanded* it. He fully expects His command to take precedence over our own wishes and desires. He expects that if we truly love Him like we say we do then we will follow His decree and work to love each other *by an act of sheer will*. Sometimes that's exactly what it takes.
